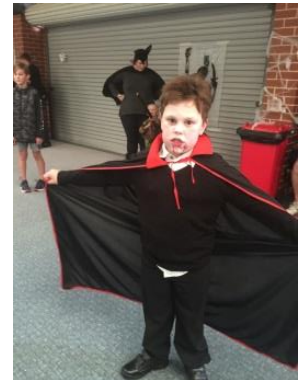


Room 22 did a superb job organising a cup cake sale Wednesday, 24 October with \$258.90 raised toward "The Kids Cancer Project".
