# **AUSLAN SIGNING**

As advised last term, we are learning Auslan Sign Language across the school as our Language Other Than English (LOTE). It has been fantastic to see all our students so enthusiastic and we hope that parents and carers can participate also. We will include practical demonstrations in the newsletter so that you can, as a family, practice the use of Auslan in your everyday conversations. Happy learning!





Our school is participating in the FLANNIE DAY FOOD DRIVE charity event to help raise awareness and take action on homelessness and hunger in our community.

We are asking students to wear their flannies (flannelette shirt) to school on FLANNIE DAY, Wednesday August 7<sup>th</sup>, and to <u>donate non-perishable</u> food items for the FLANNIE DAY Food Drive or make a gold coin donation. Students can bring their gold coin and/or food donations in to school any time from now up until FLANNIE DAY.

Our food donations will go to Foodbank, who are the local organization who strive to help locals who have fallen on tough times.

It has been determined that: Every 500 grams donated = 1 standard meal; and Every \$1 donated = 2 meals. Our school goal is to donate 300 meals / 150 kg.

### **Important Details:**

Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup> August is FLANNIE DAY Students (and parents too) wear your flannie to school (you may prefer for your child to wear their flannie over their usual school clothes).

Bring in non-perishable food donations and/or make a gold coin donation.

Give your gold coin donations to: Your child's classroom teacher

Only non-perishable foods can be donated. Here are a few suggestions: CANS of soup, baked beans, tuna, veggies, peaches, juices; JARS of peanut butter, vegemite, honey or other spreads, baby food, pasta sauces, curry sauces; PACKETS of pasta, rice, noodles or packet meals; BOXES of breakfast cereal, long life milk. Cans must be sealed, cannot be dented or the labels of the can damaged or scratched off.

We know that FLANNIE DAY will be a fun day for students as well as an opportunity to learn about the important role that each one of us can play in supporting those experiencing hardship in our community. We hope you are as keen as we are to team up to help make a difference in the lives of disadvantaged Aussies.

On FLANNIE DAY we will be taking some photos, which may be posted on social media.

Litter recycling project

'Not our rubbish, but our beaches are for all of us to share'

Staff and students from Rooms 14 and 21 are embarking on a litter recycling project that will lead to Science and Art activities in the classroom. Staff and students will travel to Middleton Beach and Emu Point to collect litter every Wednesday in Term 3 between recess and lunch times. Students will collect 'safe' litter from the beach under the supervision of staff, and then carry out an audit of the litter collected. Back in the classroom the students will create artwork with some of the litter that has been cleaned, while the audit will be used by students to create graphs and charts as a visual measure of the type of litter they have found.


